

Comments on the Rec 6 CWG's report from Internet Society of China

Internet Society of China expresses gratitude to Rec 6 CWG for discussing this important issue and publishing the final report in regard to the MOPO in DAG4. But CWG's report does not incorporate Internet Society of China's comments on DAG4 relating to the MOPO (<http://forum.icann.org/lists/4gtld-guide/msg00036.html>). Internet Society of China reiterates its position on MOPO and urges ICANN consider them in the next DAG version.

I . Incapacity of the ICC as DRSP

As stated in DAG4, MOPO and Community objection involves races, culture, geography, religion and linguistics which is beyond the scope of business dispute. These areas obviously fall out of the scope and expertise of a chamber of commerce. Therefore, we propose to remove the description that ICC is going to be the DRSP in the next version of DAG.

II . Developing countries participating in new gTLD plan

It reads in the DAG that the interest party shall pay for 18,5000 US dollars per string ,and ICANN will probably charge

registry services review fee, dispute resolution filing fee, community priority evaluation fee and string contention fee etc. As the Internet in the developing countries is still in its early stages, such huge charges would definitely stifle the initiative of the developing countries to apply for new gTLDs, and it will go against balanced development of the global Internet. It is expected that ICANN adopt a favorable fee policy for the developing countries.
